## About iJustice

iJustice, an initiative of Centre for Civil Society, is a public interest legal advocacy initiative which supports and assists individuals and groups across India to challenge violations of fundamental rights and the rule of law. We use strategic litigation and advocacy on issues which apart from having an impact on the lives of litigants, have the ability to set precedents on the limits of constitutional powers exercised through state action.

### **Our Mission**

To advance the rule of law based on individual freedom and economic liberty through litigation and advocacy.

As a litigator, iJustice uses philosophically consistent arguments and strategies in favour of advancing a jurisprudence based on individual liberties and the rule of law protected by the Constitution. At the same time, we will take these cases to the court of public opinion and build awareness around the issues involved.

iJustice continuously develops research on issues that act as barriers to the individual's exercise of his/ her fundamental rights. Our comprehensive research forms the backbone of our litigation efforts and advocacy with the government, lawmakers and the public.

## Areas of work

### **Right to livelihood:**

Barriers in the form of laws and state policies, faced in various sectors, which curb the realisation of the right to livelihood and consequently attaining economic freedom.

### **Right to Education:**

Disparity in recognition norms for government schools on the one hand and low-budget private schools, being contrary to the object of the Right to Education Act.

### **Freedom of Speech and Expression:**

Research and analysis of criminal provisions under various laws which impede upon the fundamental right to speech and expression.

### **Right to Property:**

Research on the impact of abolition of right to property as a fundamental right in the Constitution.

### **Other Areas:**

We are open to taking up issues in keeping with the philosophy of iJustice.
